

An Update from the Church at Liberty Square
March 13th, 2020

Dear Church Family,

I wanted to give you an update on the ongoing situation that is the Coronavirus, especially as it relates locally to our community and specifically to our church family. We have been notified by the Georgia Department of Public Health of additional positive COVID-19 cases that attended our church in our Sunday morning gatherings over the last two weeks. It is recommended that if you attended our gathering on March 1st that you self-isolate at home and monitor symptoms through March 15th. If you attended our Sunday morning gathering on March 8th, then it is recommended that you self-isolate at home and monitor symptoms through March 22nd. Symptoms to monitor for are fever with cough and shortness of breath. If you develop these symptoms, call your health care provider.

Because of these developments, and the overall escalation of our community and nation's task in dealing with COVID-19, we will be gathering to worship only online for the next two Sunday mornings**, March 15th and March 22nd. Please worship with us at 10:30AM beginning this Sunday online at www.libertysq.org We will not meet on campus on Wednesday night, March 18th, either.


